## Horneck killed in cycle-truck crash

A 21-year-old School Hill man was killed Monday night, when he his motorcycle was struck by a truck that apparently failed to stop for a stop sign.

Davis F. Horneck, 12208 Marken Road, was killed in the crash which occurred at the intersection of Marken Road and Point Creek Road in the Town of Meeme. The accident occurred at approximately 11 p.m.

Officers from the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Department said that a truck, driven by Russell R. Koeppen, 32, 10729 Spring Lake Road, Valders, allegedly failed to stop for a stop sign on Point Creek Road.

Horneck had been travelling south on Marken Road at the time of the accident.

The victim was dragged by the truck following the impact.

According to Chief Deputy Coroner Debra Kakatsch, Horneck was pronounced dead at the scene of severe head injuries.

Inspector Ken Peterson of the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Department indicated that charges are pending against Koeppen in connection with the fatality. Peterson noted that Koeppen had been drinking prior to the accident, and that the department is waiting for blood test results to determine charges.

Koeppen and a passenger, Kevin D. Wislinsky, 35, W4134 Highway 32, Elkhart Lake, were transported to a Sheboygan hospital for medical treatment.

### Davis Horneck

Davis F. Horneck, 21, of 12208 Marken Road, Kiel, (School Hill) died Monday night, August 5, as a result of an auto and motorcycle accident.

He was born September 29, 1969, at Chilton, son of Dale and Darlene Waack Horneck. Davis attended Kiel High School. He was a member of Bethlehem United Church of Christ, Town of Schleswig. His interests included being a member of the Ant Hill Mob, playing baseball on Hogan's Baseball team, bowling and bean bag.

Survivors include his parents, Dale and Darlene of School Hill; one daughter, Kristie of Kiel; three sister, Dawn (Paul) Williams of Sheboygan Falls; (Daphne) Anthony Grybush of Kiel; Daisy Horneck of School Hill; two brothers, David (Chris) Horneck of New Holstein; Davin Horneck of School Hill; his paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Francis Horneck of Elkhart Lake; one niece, four nephews; and numerous aunts, uncles and cousins. He was preceded in death by his maternal grandparents and paternal grandmother.

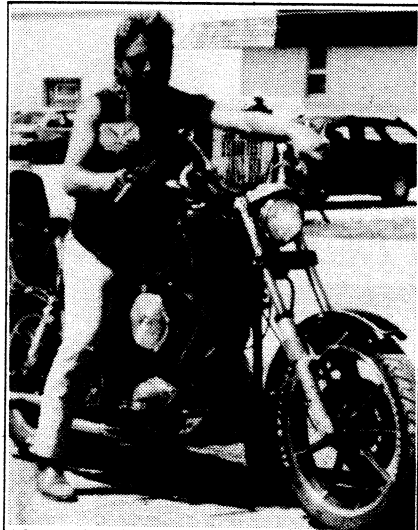
